Dear JCCA Members,

As you all likely know, on April 2 Governor Kemp signed a Shelter in Place Order for the State of Georgia that went into effect on April 3 at 6:00 pm. The order was to be in effect until April 14. However, the Governor extended the Public Health State of Emergency until May 13 and the Shelter in Place Order until April 30. It can certainly feel very isolating to be under a Shelter in Place order, but let's all work together to help flatten the curve and look forward to putting this pandemic behind us.

We do have some positive news from our state government with the creation of a coronavirus task force. Sadly, criminals never take a day off and this task force will be aimed at better protecting the citizens of Georgia from criminal fraud stemming from the pandemic.

The Governor has also announced that the State of Georgia has joined forces with CVS Health to increase access to rapid COVID-19 testing. Starting on April 8th, CVS will be operating drive-thru rapid COVID-19 testing, offered by Abbott Laboratories, at a site on Georgia Tech's campus. At full capacity, the site will be able to conduct up to 1,000 tests per day.
