August Zoning News

July 9th Planning Commission meeting Decisions:

Text Amendment A-19-001

Background: With an increase in the number of vape shops in Johns Creek, at the June 3, 2019 Council Meeting the Mayor and City Council initiated a Text Amendment (A-19-001) to the City of Johns Creek Zoning Ordinance to add related definitions and limit the floor area dedicated to sale or advertisement of vape or vape-related products to no more than twenty-five percent (25%).

New Community Development Director Named for Johns Creek

Johns Creek hired Ben Song as the city's new Community Development Director. Song comes to the City of Johns Creek from Gwinnett County Government where he was the Director for the Real Estate and Records Management Division.

He previously served as the Community
Development Director for the City of Brookhaven
and has extensive local government, planning, and
land use experience. Song held supervisory roles
overseeing land use, zoning, and real estate in
Gwinnett County Government and in the cities of
Peachtree Corners and Brookhaven. Earlier in his
career, Song served as a Planner III in Johns Creek.

An active member of the American Planning Association and the Georgia Planning Association, Song oversaw the adoption of the City of Brookhaven's first Comprehensive Plan, directed and processed the annexation of approximately 160 acres of land for the city, and improved the city's building permit review process.

Join Autrey Mill Nature Preserve for a City of Johns Creek initiative as they clean up our City's

namesake- the Johns Creek. Homeowners along the creek are encouraged to venture into their backyards to help with the project. Debris and litter collected may be brought to Autrey Mill Nature Preserve where we will properly dispose of the waste.

Join Autrey Mill and Fulton County Water Resources down at the Old Alabama Johns Creek overpass where we will dip our toes, survey for fish, gather litter, and learn the process for Adopt-A-Stream Bacterial Monitoring. Afterward, the Fulton County Department of Public Works will take participants on a tour of the Tom Lowe Atlanta Fulton Water Treatment Facility. The tour is restricted to the first 20 participants and requires a minimum of 10. Tour participants must be over the age of 7 and wear closed-toe shoes.

Schools are Starting!!

School is back in session. By mid- August, the majority of students in Georgia will be back in the classroom. Students attending Fulton County Schools begin on Monday, August 12. As children head back, here are a few tips to help keep them safe and ready to learn.



 Ask your children to use both straps when wearing their backpack to evenly distribute the weight on their shoulders.

- Never pass a bus from behind or from either direction if you're on an undivided road – if it is stopped to load or unload children.
- If the yellow or red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, traffic must stop.
- The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough back to allow them space to safely enter and exit the bus.
- Don't block the crosswalk when stopped at a red light or waiting to make a turn, forcing pedestrians to go around you; this could put them in the path of moving traffic.
- Please watch for officers directing traffic.
